General Business – President

- The number of games rule was discussed and approved by captains at the November 2024 captains meeting, but the constitution has not been update as yet, can I have a vote that the constitution is updated to reflect “Players must play matches on 5 separate tournament nights during the course of the any season”.
 - NOTE: For ease of playing people in the finals, the match secretary will publish a full list of players and the number of matches they have played at the conclusion of the round robin matches clearly showing eligible and ineligible players for the finals.
- Fees for upcoming competition will remain the same as 2025. \$20 per team per week and \$10 per player registration.
- Captain’s meetings moving forward will be outlined in the calendar and will be every second month with the committee meeting when required in between.

 1. This Saturday night – Presentation Night - 6.30pm Pittwater RSL
 2. Team nominations for first comp by Tuesday 20th January (Simon will chase new teams)
 3. First Captains Meeting for 2025 will be Tuesday 3rd February.

 5. Wednesday 11th February – Round 1 of Summer Comp

General Business - Attendees

- Les B questioned the changing of the Constitution in relation minimum of 5 games to play finals, concern being in a longer season that strong players may just satisfy the minimum, the be eligible to play in lower division than they should be and impact finals. It was agreed that this is a change in rules and not currently in Constitution and therefore flexibility remains to ensure it suits the competition. Proposed this remain and this be addressed in early 2026 when we have a better feel for what the competition will look like.
- Darryl suggested that we look at when competition and darts days are held during 2026, noting there is quite a few currently on at the end of the second season and look to spread them out. Josh agreed and confirmed that this has been discussed within Builders teams and next year's day will be during the year.
- Darryl made comment that good to see Association and team numbers grow but should look to protect integrity of competition and seek to have reliable teams that will not need to forfeit.
- Rob S commented that he has been working on getting a team out of Manly Bowling club, currently owned by Mounties Group with some reluctance and wanting more control over it. Do have the approval of GM and so will continue to explore.
- Rob S stated with the Players Championship, with growing numbers this is becoming more time consuming and so will look to just have win/loss ratio instead of Leg differences.
- Les stated he would like to see Team nickname brought back, consensus of group was in support with suggestion of having club, pub or brewery name first and have nickname added.
- James wants to see improvement in collection of fees, has asked each Captain at start of next season to indicate who, how and when fee will be paid with view of getting these earlier in the season. Can generate invoice for any club that needs one.
- Lesley acknowledged and thanked Captains for their work and getting information to her in timely and presentable manner.
- Ron requested that the bank details be changed as he is still receiving statements in the mail.
